

A Brief History of Oktoberfest

On 12th of October 1810, Crown Prince Ludwig, who later became King Ludwig I, married the Princess Teresa of Sassonia-Hildburghausen. All the citizens of Munich were invited to attend the celebration held in the fields in front of the city gate to celebrate the happy royal event. Since then, the fields have been called “Theresienwiese” shortened to “Wies’n” (Teresa’s meadow) in honour of the Princess. The closing ceremony at the Theresienwiese included a horse race, a veritable feast for the whole of Bavaria. The following year the decision to repeat the horse races gave rise to the origin of the Oktoberfest tradition.

In 1811, in order to promote agriculture and the Bavarian economy, an agricultural fair was also organized. The horse race from which everything takes its origin no longer takes place today. From 1819 onwards the citizens of Munich assumed responsibility for the organization of the festival, making it an annual event. Thereafter, the duration of the Oktoberfest was lengthened, and the start date brought forward, to take advantage of the longer and warmer days of September.

In 1910, the Oktoberfest celebrated its 100th anniversary with the consumption of 120,000 litres of beer... a record for that time! 2010 was the 200th anniversary of the Oktoberfest. A horse race took place in historical costumes on the opening day. In the southern part of the Theresienwiese, the “History of Wiesn” (Historic Oktoberfest) is held where a special beer is served for the occasion.

Ajax Downs

Ajax Downs has a long history of Quarter Horse Racing in Canada since 1969. The original name of 'Picov Downs' was changed in 2006 with the establishment of a new slots facility and construction of a full 6-furlong oval racetrack which was completed in 2009.

Since its opening in 1969, Picov Downs has been host to American Quarter Horse races in Ajax, Ontario. Founded by Alexander Picov, a Russian immigrant coming to Canada in 1921, Picov Downs was built on the family's land. Placement between a highway and a creek dictated its unique shape, a straight with a right hand turn.
