Dear Residents and Families,

We are have received a positive test result for one of our independent-living residents.

Dr. Rosenberg from Michael Garron Hospital has asked that we isolate our 3<sup>rd</sup> and 4<sup>th</sup> floor residents and initiate contact tracing for the positive resident dating back to Oct. 23.

Because of the length of time required to complete initial contact tracing, I have taken the extra step and locked down the entire building.

Our plan is as follows:

1. Isolate 1<sup>st</sup>, 2<sup>nd</sup>, 3<sup>rd</sup> and 4<sup>th</sup> floor residents in full droplet and contact precautions with in-room meal tray service.
2. Reach out to Toronto Public Health to determine CT value for the resident concerned (this will help us determine when the resident became infectious).
3. Initiate contact tracing back to October 23 for positive resident.
4. Assign staff to serve one floor only (i.e., no shifting from one floor to another).
5. Disinfect all common areas and dining room.

We will retest all residents beginning with our 1<sup>st</sup> and 2<sup>nd</sup> floor residents on Sunday, followed by our residents on the 3<sup>rd</sup> and 4<sup>th</sup> floor on Monday.

Once we have received negative test results for these residents, the quarantine will be lifted (at the earliest, next Thursday).



## Presentation Manor

In addition to 166 negatives, we are awaiting 150 additional results from the November 10 testing.

If you have been designated as an essential visitor for a resident, you will still be able to enter Presentation Manor. You will however, be required to have a face shield in addition to a mask. (We can supply the shield from our stock at our cost).

I will be moving into Presentation Manor tomorrow for the duration of the outbreak.
