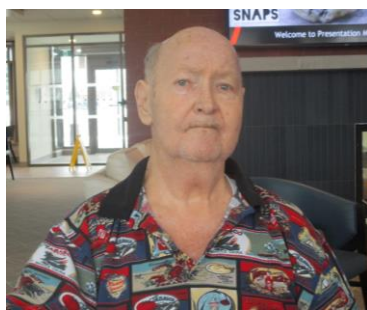

**Resident Spotlight: Margaret Jackson**



Margaret Jackson was born in Derbyshire, England in the August of 1930, a little while after her twin brother Arthur. She grew up during World War II in a country at the forefront of

the war –but thanks in part to her parents her childhood was not hindered by the effects of the war. Margaret attended Cambridge University for nursing and worked as a nurse in England for some time. After living in England for nearly 22 years, Margaret accompanied her older sister Joyce across the ocean to Canada on a ship called the SS Atlantic. Spending nearly a week sailing across the Atlantic Ocean, Margaret was horribly seasick throughout the journey; but while the sickness had been a terrible experience, her time spent on the ship was unparalleled. At 23 years old, Margaret was suddenly living in an entirely new country. She found work at Loblaws and it was there that she met her husband for the first time - Kenneth Richards Jackson, a Scottish man working in the warehouse. They went on to be married for 61 years – during which time they also became the proud parents of two daughters, Janice and Patricia. Margaret during her 20s, had also enlisted in the Canadian Women’s Army Corps. She trained at Camp Borden, working as part of the war effort on the Canadian front. Though her time as a recruit was short, due to the extraordinary skill, effort, and leadership qualities that she demonstrated Margaret was awarded the honor of a Silver Spoon.
