

Day of Independence (Mexico) *Independencia de México*

Often confused with Cinco de Mayo by people living in the United States, Mexico's independence day is actually September 16. The date marks the moment when Miguel Hidalgo y Costilla, a Catholic priest known as Father Hidalgo, made the first cry for independence. After a moving speech in the Mexico town of Dolores, Hidalgo took up the banner of the Virgin of Guadalupe, a Roman Catholic image of the Virgin Mary as she appears to Juan Diego, an indigenous Mexican believer who was later sainted by the church.

"Independence commemorates the beginning [of the struggle]," – Elena Albarrán, an associate professor of history and global and intercultural studies at Miami University in Ohio. *"In this case, you celebrate the moment of insurgency, the **possibility**, and the **hope**."*

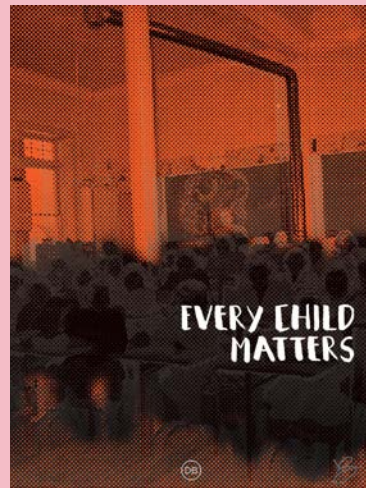
**Night at The Opera:

The cost of the shirt is \$20.

The film follows a married couple, an actress and a stage director, going through a coast-to-coast divorce.

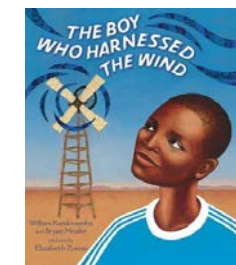


Isle of Dogs – Friday, September 11 at 7:00
